

- 6) When the prosecutor asks Luz a question on cross examination about Travis attempting to rape Luz, Luz answers "I never said it was rape." Do you agree with that statement and if not, why do you think Luz was so adamant?
- 7) Nic makes a dramatic decision at the end. Do you agree with his reasoning and with what he did?
- 8) How do you define a good mother? Do you think Abby or Luz fits your description? If not, why not?
