


QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION

- 1) How would you define Lauren's, Cate's, Max's, and Olivia's relationships with each other? And how do those relationships change as the blog grows in popularity? Which character was your favorite and why?
- 2) Cate, Lauren, Olivia, and Max are all dealing with bosses who abuse their power in some way. How have our workplace cultures perpetuated this type of behavior? Do you believe their decision to start *Twentysomething* and write about their bosses was justified? Discuss why or why not.
- The book begins by Cate saying, "The signs were always there," followed by examples of a toxic environment that she'd noticed after three years at Larcey Publishing. Why do you think it took her years to realize these were signs of a harmful workplace? Have you had to deal with a toxic work environment, and if so, what are some other signs that you've experienced?
- 4) Max experiences terrible behavior at the hands of both her male and female bosses, Richard and Sheena. Why do you think Sheena acts the way that she does even if she herself has been through workplace abuse? What reasons might she have had for not coming forward or standing up for other women in the office sooner?
- Cate, Lauren, Olivia, and Max all work in creative industries where the boundaries between work and life are often blurred, all for the sake of their "dream job." What negative and positive roles does ambition play in the novel and in the lives of our characters—both in relation to their jobs, their website, and each other? Would you sacrifice your mental health and well-being for your dream job? Is there a point in these women's relationships with their bosses that would have been your breaking point?
- 6) In the email James writes to Pete after Lauren reports him, he explains his side of the story. What is the problem with he said/she said situations? If you were Pete, who would you believe? What kind of manipulation tactics does James use to get Lauren to do what he wants? How does that manipulation force two very different sides to the story?
- 7) Matt's, Pete's, Nate's, and Richard's behaviors are all somewhere on the toxicity spectrum. How would you rank them, from best to worst? How much awareness do you think they have of their bad behavior?
- Throughout the book, Charlie is constantly taking Max's work and claiming it as his own. What part does Max play in this behavior? And how important are Alyssa's recognition and positive affirmation of Max's work to get Max to finally stand up for herself?
- 9) Discuss the meaning of the title **Smile and Look Pretty**. Have you ever been told a version of that phrase?
- **10)** What will be the thing you remember most from **Smile and Look Pretty**?

- Pour and enjoy




BITCHES GET STUFF DONE DESK WHISKEY
