

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 3. Which love interest did you prefer most for Emma? Do you think she made the right choice in the end?
- 4. Emma describes her work friends as family. Which is more important—friends or family? Do you believe that friends can become family?
- 5. Discuss the role of food in Emma's story. How is food a source of healing and connection in your own life?
- 6. Have you ever discovered a family secret? How did it change your perception of your family? Did it change how you felt about yourself?
- 7. Henry tells Emma that her family secret is the thing he's had to keep hidden his whole life. Are you good at keeping secrets? Have you ever held a secret for someone else? Is there ever a responsibility to tell someone else's secret? Should parents keep secrets from their children?
- 8. Have you seen the movie Sabrina? Discuss how the author updated that movie plot in The Audrey Hepburn Estate. What is your favorite Audrey Hepburn film?
- 9. What did you learn about Audrey Hepburn from reading this novel? Has your opinion of her changed?
- 10. Leo tells Emma, "Home isn't a place. A house is a physical space, but a home? Home is the people you want to be with, the ones you come back to at the end of a long day. It's the life you create for yourself, not an actual place." Do you agree with this? What is your definition of home?
